Sierra Leone Ministry of Health and National Public Health Agency Confirms Polio Virus (PV3) Case

The Ministry of Health (MOH), in collaboration with the National Public Health Agency (NPHA), investigated a suspected case of poliovirus type 3 (PV3) in a child from Kambia district.

Swift Action and Reassurance:

- Prompt testing was conducted at the Institute Pasteur in Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire and confirmed at the National Institute of Communicable Disease (NICD) in South Africa.
- Fortunately, testing confirmed it was not a wild poliovirus case.
- The child was severely malnourished and shedding vaccine-derived poliovirus, a rare occurrence.

Ongoing Efforts:

- The NPHA and MOH are actively collaborating with neighboring countries on cross-border surveillance.
- The NPHA, MOH, and WHO along with technical partners, are actively:

- o Educating the public about polio and vaccination.
- Strengthening national surveillance systems.
- o Implementing a robust response plan.

Vaccination is Key:

- Health officials urge everyone to ensure all children under five receive the recommended vaccinations, including Polio.
- Vaccination remains the most effective way to protect children from debilitating diseases.
